

New Generation ELLIOTT 55 FAST CRUISER



he Elliott 55 is an excitingly innovative cruiser. The primary design pre-requisites were for a well fitted out cruiser that will cross oceans quickly. The entire design of the Elliott 55 is based around ease of handling in both live-


aboard and sailing mode.

The sail handling systems are predominantly under the deck and lead to the cockpit enabling the control of all functions to be carried out without leaving the cockpit steering position. Powered by a 100HP diesel Yanmar engine, the Elliott 55 has great performance under motor.

The accommodation is open plan and on two levels. The upper level provides outside viewing whilst seated at the dinette. The large cockpit lends itself to outside entertaining with use of a canopy when necessary.

This is a true new generation cruising yacht which will have exceptional performance and undoubtedly set new trends in cruising design. There are numerous built-in unique features which will make this new yacht an eye catcher in every port. The owners of the first Elliott 55 are looking forward to cruising their yacht in the Pacific in the New Year.
